

CHILDREN AND YOUTH SERVICES

In 2023, CWS Jersey City expanded exponentially! The office grew from a staff of **40** to a staff of nearly **130**. Across all programs, the office served over **4,000** unique clients. From initial reception and placement services like housing and school enrollment to employment orientation and extended case management for families and vulnerable individuals, our services empower individuals and families to build fulfilling lives.



191 New Neighbors Welcomed via Reception and Placement Program

Through our Reception and Placement program, the CWS resettlement team provides initial welcome and core services to new neighbors for the first 90 days after arrival, empowering individuals and families to reach self-sufficiency.



2,717 Clients Receiving Refugee Cash Assistance

CWS Jersey City has offered Refugee Cash Assistance since our office opened in 2015. We provide a 12-month cash stipend for qualifying asylees, refugees, Cuban/Haitian Entrants, parolees. and other humanitarian migrants.



1,986 Clients Enrolled in English Language Training

CWS JC offers remote English language classes to clients enrolled in our RSS and RCA programs. We offer English placement assessments to all classes and place clients in an appropriate level. CWS JC recently hired five new English teachers - we are thrilled to expand our ELT program.



1,141 Children Welcomed Through HSPRS

Our Home Study and Post Release Services (HSPRS) program launched in March 2022. In 2023, we have welcomed 1,141 clients from 27 countries living in 43 states. Our HSRPS team is proud to support unaccompanied minors recently released from ORR custody.



Two New Major Programs Launched

In 2023 CWS Jersey City received grants from federal Office of Refugee Resettlement to launch two major programs: Services to Afghan Survivors Impacted by Combat Program, which offers comprehensive mental health support to Afghans living in New Jersey, and the Employer Engagement Program, which promotes vocational ESL and further supports businesses in hiring refugees.



272 Employment-Eligible Clients Placed in Jobs

The CWS Jersey City employment team expanded its staff to include Dari, Pashto, Ukrainian, and Spanish speakers and worked creatively with thousands of employment-eligible clients to build resumes, offer professional development courses and prepare folks for successful, long term employment.

Mohammad's Story



Staff Attorney Florence Otaigbe shares her experience with an Afghan client, from initial resettlement to legal permanent residency:

I first met Mohammad when he reached out to Legal Department looking for assistance after receiving his Chief of Mission Approval which granted him a Special Immigrant Visa as basis to apply for a green card. At the time, he did not know much about the next steps, but he knew what his end goal was- a green card and permanent residency in his new home where he's been safe from the dangers he would've faced in Afghanistan due to his military work with the United States. When I let him know that his green card was at the office, he insisted that I be there to give to him. I made sure I was there, and I am so glad I was. Mohammad expressed so much kindness and gratitude that I will never forget. As he left, he told me, "have a good time forever," and I hope he has a good time forever too because he never has to worry another day about whether he can continue to stay in the United States or not. Hopefully, this is something all Afghans will be able to experience soon!

2023 Legal Department Highlights



Ukrainian Legal Assistance Team attorney Brandon Dolinger and paralegal Valery Isakov filed over **240** applications.

- 152 Employment Authorization Documents applications
- 71 Temporary Protected Status applications
- 15 Individuals included on asylum applications
- 2 Green Card applications
- 5 Travel documents



The OFBI clinic program hosted two pro se Employment Authorization clinics, the first in partnership with Fragomen, Del Rey, Bernsen & Loewy LLP and the second in partnership with Akin Gump Strauss Hauer & Feld LLP. Clinics assisted 37 clients with prepared and submitting work permit applications.



CWS Jersey City joined the New York Lawyers for Public Interest *Get on Board!* event to recruit attorneys to join the CWS Jersey City Migrant Justice Action Counsel, and raised over \$20,000 to support legal services.

CNS Tersey City and Tent Partnership for Refugees Hiring Fairs





CWS Jersey City and the Tent Partnership for Refugees co-hosted three job fairs in 2023. Representatives from over 25 companies, including Starbucks, Amazon, Chobani, Marriot, Panda Express, and more, travelled to Jersey City to interview, recruit, and hire CWS Jersey City clients. Quarterly job fairs began in May 2023, and over 300 clients from around the world have attended. The office is eager to continue collaborating with Tent and will continue quarterly hiring fairs in 2024.

"The hiring events have brought refugees and employers together in ways that benefits everyone. It has been encouraging for refugees to see the commitment from employers towards supporting them and giving them the chance to work and start to rebuild their lives in the U.S. In turn, employers have gained valuable new employees who are invested and bring new skills and unique backgrounds to their teams! We're excited to see news of the events continue to spread and to host future fairs in 2024."

Ukrainian Humanitarian Assistance Program Updates

In 2023, CWS Jersey City screened a total of 1,142 potential Ukrainian clients, and successfully served 846 qualified Ukrainian Humanitarian Parolees through the Preferred Communities GAPS program for Ukrainians. We are proud to have provided our Ukrainian clients with comprehensive essential services, including Medicaid, SNAP, cash assistance, ELT classes, and more, assuring clients receive the vital support they require.



Our new neighbors are from all over Ukraine and now live in Hudson, Bergen and Passaic counties in New Jersey. Ukrainians have brought their unique culture, skills, and vibrancy to our community and we could not be more grateful. Seeing the program grow since in launched in late 2023 has been incredibly fulfilling for our team.



77 kids Enrolled with CWS's Ukrainian School Impact Team

In 2023, 77 Ukrainian children were enrolled in New Jersey schools with assistance from School Impact Grant case managers. In addition to this, 8 children, ages 0-5, were enrolled in NJ Head Start and Early Head Start to receive comprehensive early education services. In addition to these services, all students were given the opportunity to join CWS Summer Programming, sign up for tutoring, and take part in school advocacy.

CWS is proud to hire staff from our many diverse client populations. We currently have five former CWS JC Ukrainian Humanitarian Parolee clients on staff: Karyna Dibrova, Alona Bondarieva, Nikita Kachur, Nataliia Mishyna, and Olha Livel work as case managers in the Refugee Cash Assistance, Refugee Support Services, and Employment Support Services programs.

Ukrainian Humanitarian Parole Assistance Program Manager Mohammad Izadi reflects on the past year's achievements:

Our office has achieved some remarkable successes. One of the most significant achievements has been our ability to secure housing for a substantial number of clients in need. Our commitment to providing prompt assistance is evident in the waiting time for clients from initial contact to program enrollment, which has been reduced to 1 day. This swift response ensures that our clients receive timely help and support. Additionally, through various programs, we have been successful in providing computers and phones to almost all clients who needed them, enhancing their access to communication and resources.


Overall, despite the challenges, our office's dedication and perseverance have led to significant achievements, improving the lives of the Ukrainian population we serve through the PC GAPS program.

Highlights from CWS JC Summer Camp 2023

CWS JC hosted our second annual summer camp in July and August!
