Requests for Upfront Payment: Never make upfront payments without fully verifying the authenticity of the rental and the landlord. If asked for payments before signing a lease or viewing the property in person, it's likely a scam.



Lack of Verifiable Information: Before committing to a rental, ensure you can verify the information provided in the ad. Research the address, the landlord, and any other relevant details to confirm the legitimacy of the offer.
